Other Settings

- The `$CFG->divertallemailsto` and `$CFG->divertallemailsexcept` settings are another way to manage emails whilst developing;
- The `$CFG->cachejs` and `$CFG->cachetemplates` settings help when dealing with caching, though I have rarely ever used them. The `$CFG->cachejs` setting is important if you are compiling JavaScript for your plugin as, since Moodle 3.8, all JavaScript is served minimised.
